WEST SWINDON ART TRAIL

WALK, EXPLORE, ENJOY

Welcome to West Swindon's wonderful outdoor art works. This is a six mile route on footpaths and cycle ways. Here are brief directions and the what.3.words location. We hope you enjoy the trail – tell us how it went! Start and finish at the West Swindon District Centre. Let's get going!

Behind the Link Centre, at the subway to Rowton Heath Way, you will find

- 1 A Walk on the Wild Side, 2025, subway mural** commissioned by West Swindon Parish Council by Jaksta Art, w3w: **covers.librarian.passes**

Leave the district centre, heading across Whitehill Way at the crossing to the Shaw Ridge Leisure complex. By Ten Pin, you will find

- 2 Diana Dors, 1991, Artist: John Clinch. Materials: Bronze,** w3w: **bikes.depend.topped**

Exit from here following the path to arrive at Shaw Ridge Linear Park. Head right towards The Bramptons. Here you will find

- 3 How the Mighty Fall, 1989, Artist: Tim Sandys-Renton. Materials: Cast Iron,** w3w: **stem.firm.frogs**

Bonus: Shaw Ridge Primary School has a sculpture, Confluence, Artist: Gordon Dickinson, 2006

Take the next right turn on to a path which takes you across The Bramptons, on to Shaw Road, cross the road and turn left. Follow the bend of the road, go straight across at the roundabout on to Cartwright Drive and turn right by the play areas. Here you will find

- 4 White Horse Pacified, 1987. Artist: Julie Livsey. Materials: Steel and Concrete** w3w: **issue.doors.dome**

Return to Cartwright Drive, follow it to Roughmoor Way and the subway for Brookfield School, here you find

- 5 A Bear's Picnic, 2025, subway mural** commissioned by West Swindon Parish Council by Ed Poster w3w: **courier.chained.deferring**

Return to Roughmoor Way, follow the cycle path to Saddleback Road, Friesian Close, under Tewkesbury Way through the subway, along Tregoze Way, to

- 6 Hey Diddle Diddle, 1992, Artist: Vega Bermejo. Materials: Portland Stone**

w3w: **courier.chained.deferring**

Follow Tregoze Way/Hay Lane, **HALF WAY POINT**, stay on the right hand side footpath to Sudeley Way, cross over the road and head on the old road towards Windmill Hill Business Park. Walk through the subway and continue forwards where you will come out on Worsley Rd opposite Freshbrook Village Centre.

- 7 Nexus, 1986. Artist: Hideo Furuta. Materials: Blue Pennant Stone** w3w: **untruth.material.market**

Leave Freshbrook Village Centre heading towards Worsley Road.

Bonus: Check the centre planters for the metal sculptures The Globes, 2024, West Swindon Parish Council

Follow Worsley Rd, then turn into Langdale Drive and follow to the end, turn into Roundway Down, exit left into Toothill Park. Walk through the park following the path, exit to Whitecastle. Stay on this path until it ends at Dunwich Drive, turn right and head to the subway, where you will find

- 8 A Walk Through Nature, 2025, subway mural** commissioned by West Swindon Parish Council by Jenna Fox w3w: **lifts.garage.cups**

Return to Dunwich Drive and follow the road up to Toothill Village Centre. Here you will find

- 9 The Watchers, 1982, Artist: Carleton Attwood. Material: Cement Fondue** w3w: **garden.fell.deeply**

Leave Toothill Village Centre for Stokesay Drive, turn right to take the bridge over Tewkesbury Way, at the end of the bridge turn left, follow the footpath alongside the stream. At the pedestrian lights cross over and walk a few metres along the path. Here you will find

- 10 Looking to the Future, 1985, Artist: Jon Buck. Material: Glass Fibre Resin** w3w: **wallet.wells.winks**

Bonus:

·Take notice of the mosaic mural inside the Link Centre by the swimming pool exit.

·Visit the Superheroes subway mural at Rivermead Skate Park, 2024, Jaksta Art

·Note the Grade II listed Spectrum Building, 1979, by the architect Sir Norman Foster off Rivermead Drive
