Subject: Graffiti Murals

#### 1. Paint-fest Mural Artists

1.1 At the November 2023 meeting of this Committee, a report on options for graffiti murals was considered. Minute 144 detailed

**RESOLVED** that the Committee notes the option to trial a mural painting in a subway subject to budgets being available and that corporate sponsorship be investigated.

1.2 As a reminder, in the previous report, Paintfest responded with the following in reference to costs for mural works:

An overview for artist's costs:

- The size of the wall (it can be charged per sq feet, or a fixed fee set aside for the artist fairly accordingly factoring on size of wall and workdays, then the other expenses listed that follows)
- wall condition (i.e. surface condition, whether needs priming/prepping)
- materials, whether it needs any equipment for access i.e. height.

The usual charge per square feet can vary from 30£/per sq feet to 100£ per sq feet according to artist as well as condition of the wall, and type of artwork design.

1.3 Murals can create a bright statement that impacts on the neighbourhood. The Parish Council could consider a phased approach.

### 2. Costs

- 2.1 West Swindon Parish Council has 17 subways. The average subway is 95 m<sup>2</sup> Assuming the lower cost range of £30 m<sup>2</sup>, an average subway would cost upwards of a total of £2,850 and 17 subways a minimum total of £48,450. It is likely that these would be the minimum costs and would not take into account any sacrificial coatings or repair work.
- 2.2 Until an artist is identified it is difficult to assess what if any remedial work would need to be undertaken in the first instance and whether this could covered by the Parish Team or an additional cost covered by the artist's fee.
- 2.3 To progress, it would be helpful to identified preferred subways for murals

so that the size of the subway is established and a commissioning process can be initiated. The Parish Council could consider footfall, condition, prevalence of tags and size.

The highest footfall subways are likely to be

- Westpoint Police point West Swindon District Centre to Shaw Ridge
- Beaumaris to the Link Centre

The subways with a flat surface wall include

- The Chesters play area to Ridge Green
- The Chesters play area to Rivermead

Both of these have a high prevalence of tags which could make them good candidates for murals.

It is unlikely that Mannington subway could host a mural due to the walls being wet for long periods of time. A list of subways is attached as Appendix A.

# 3. Budget

3.1 The Parish Council has not factored mural costs for public open spaces into its annual budget for 2024, it could be factored into the next year's budget or, an existing budget could be reallocated. There is £5,000 allocated to Seats/Street Furniture that could be used.

## 4. Financial & Other Implications

- 4.1 Consideration would need to be given as to whether this is an effective response, generally mural art work is respected and tagged at a lower rate than non art work spaces.
- 4.2 Remedial or repair costs would need to be met by the Parish Council.
- 4.3 Work to seek sponsorship has not been initiated to date.

### 5. Recommendations

- 5.1 That this Committee notes the information in this report in order to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of introducing murals
- 5.2 If the Committee wishes to progress with a mural that it identifies a subway/s and a specification be sent to Paintfest that would allow artists to step forward and a cost to be identified.
